Vancouver Cadets Learn How to Take Off at Langley Air Museum

This weekend, sixteen cadets from the Vancouver based 111 Pegasus Royal Canadian Air Cadets Squadron travelled to Langley Air Museum with their instructors to learn the details of flight and the aviation history of Canada. These cadets learned a variety of material, from the first flight in Canada to the roaring speeds of the CF-104 Starfighter. They were allowed to apply the knowledge from classroom to the aircraft, identifying parts of an engine, wings, and describe the fundamentals of lift. “Personally, I enjoyed attending the tour because I got to learn more about the Morse code and look at vintage planes that played an important part in Canadian history.
